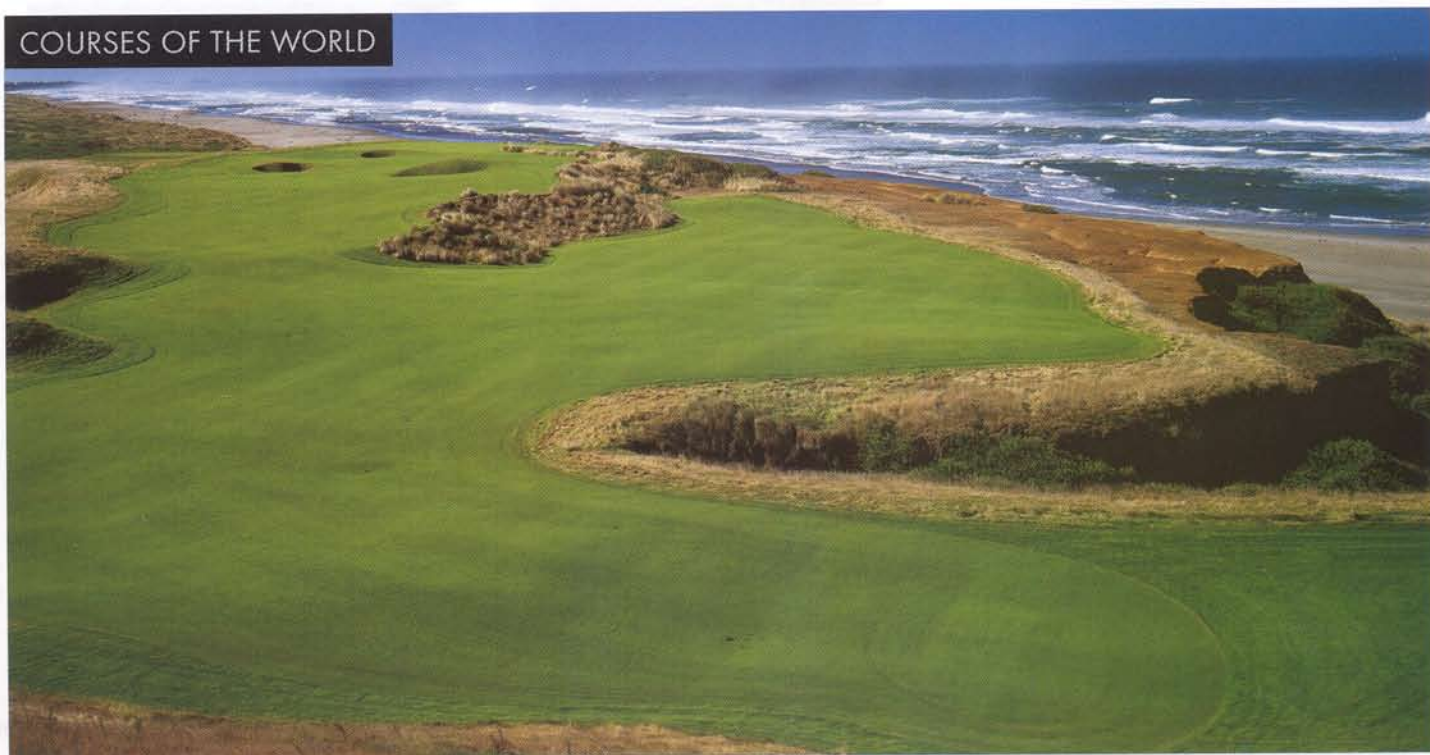

**GOLF: IT'S FUN-DAMENTAL****SNAG Game Makes Learning Easy & Enjoyable**

It's been said Tiger Woods broke 50 for nine holes at the tender age of 3. Just think where he'd be today if he had started with the SNAG game.

Designed to teach children or beginners the basics of golf, the SNAG game is an innovative teaching tool that puts an emphasis on the "fun" in fundamentals.

SNAG uses two colorful clubs, a wedge and putter, to hit the ball, about the size of a tennis ball. But rather than aiming at a hole, SNAG uses a "Flagsticky," a weighted base with a Velcro-like material the balls stick to. The clubhandles are color-coded to help teach the proper grip, with a foam rubber tee (the "launch pad"), included to hit from. With the handy "SNAG Bag" carrying case, SNAG can be played just about anywhere — especially our office.

SNAG comes with additional training aids, the Snag Snapper wand and SNAGazoo wand, each designed to help promote the correct swing, and an instructional book and video. Combined with simplified rules and fun terms, it's a great way to get your child — or yourself — involved in the game. (\$119).
